What is the current version of CPT?

The current version is the CPT 2024. There are three types of CPT codes: CPT is currently identified by the Centers for Medicare and Medicaid Services (CMS) as Level 1 of the Health Care Procedure Coding System. CPT is a registered trademark of the American Medical Association.

What is a CPT code set?

The current version is the CPT 2024. The CPT code set is also known as the HCPCS Level I codes for Medicare/Medicaid purposes. Category I codes are used for reporting services or procedures performed by physicians and other healthcare providers, tests and drugs (including vaccines) required for the performance of a service or procedure.

What is a CPT code?

Specifically, CPT codes are used to report procedures and services to federal and private payers for reimbursement of rendered healthcare. In 1966, the American Medical Association (AMA) created CPT codes to standardize reporting of medical, surgical, and diagnostic services and procedures performed in inpatient and outpatient settings.

How do I find a list of CPT codes?

For quick access to a list of CPT codes and descriptions, working medical coders typically use software with procedure code lookup, though these tools are also available to students. The key to coding success is staying current and always referencing the code sets that apply to the date of service.

Current Procedural Terminology (CPT) is a listing of descriptive terms and identifying codes for reporting medical, surgical and diagnostic services and procedures performed by physicians and other qualified health care professionals. It is developed and maintained by the American Medical Association.
