The Portuguese island of Madeira will be able to radically reduce its fossil fuel consumption while keeping electricity supply stable and reliable, thanks to battery energy storage system (BESS) technology.

Tonga is trying to reduce the carbon intensity of its energy mix and reach 50% renewable energy by 2025, then 70% by 2030. The islands burn around 13 million litres of diesel fuel each year to supply 95% of Tonga's electricity according to a document on the project prepared by Tonga Power Limited, the Pacific island Kingdom's sole electricity supplier, ...

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MITECO launched two programmes, with the first one seeking either standalone projects or thermal energy storage projects with a budget of EUR180 million, of which EUR30 million for thermal energy storage alone. The second programme is aimed at pumped hydro energy storage (PHES) with EUR100 million allocated for that technology.

The European Commission (EC) has given the green light to a EUR1.2bn (\$1.32bn) Polish scheme designed to bolster investments in electricity storage facilities. The initiative is set to support the installation of at least 5.4GW of new electricity storage capacity.

Porkeri wind farm was inaugurated at the beginning of this year, hosting seven turbines with a capacity of 6.3MW. Image: SEV. Hitachi Energy has been selected to supply a large-scale battery energy storage system (BESS) for a wind farm in the Faroe Islands, as the remote archipelago targets a goal of 100% renewable energy.

The power plant combines 39MW of solar PV with 39MW/159MWh of battery energy storage system (BESS) technology. Clearway signed 20-year power purchase agreements (PPAs) with Hawaiian Electric Company (HECO) in 2018 for Mililani Solar I and Waiawa Solar, a separate 36MW PV, 36MW/144MWh BESS project also on O'ahu.

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
